



Jaipur Art Week 2023 will celebrate the Pink City's aesthetic legacy

Whether you are interested in history, aesthetics, wildlife, adventure or food, Rajasthan never disappoints. The vibrant cultural essence of the capital, Jaipur, especially stands out. If you're visiting the city this month to enjoy the whete rehill here's a novel experience to add to your inferenzy. The second edition of Jaipur Art Week 2023 by the Public Arts Trust of India (PATT) is scheduled to take place from 180 625 January. Visitors can attend exhibitions, performances, talks, workshops and more by emerging artists from around the country. The lineup as well as themes are a reflection of the city's historical legacy of patronage as a haven for artists from near and far. Here's what to expect:

Where will Jaipur Art Week be held?

Events will be spread across many historic locations in the Pink City, including the Albert Hall Museum, Gyan Museum, Amrapali Museum, Rajmahal Palace RAO, The Open Space Society (TOSS) and ALTAR Residency at Hawa Mhala, So. with the art on display, don't forget to take in the aesthetics of your surroundings. Various local cards-based enterprises, such as Prozen Music and Jaipur Rugs, will also play a role in hosting the events.

What to catch at Jaipur Art Week 2023?



The week is set to kick off with a showcase of contemporary artist Lochan Upadhaya's first ever contemporary work at Albert Itali Museum, tittled Power Cloth 2024; Nade from brass, metal ribbons, discarded fabrics and recycled plastic, this ceremonial arch-like sculpture aims to regressent the complex sociocultural politic of a place. Another highlight is The New Thread Personal and Collective Storytelling's agroup show at player Ruga (HQ) by three female artis—Pohini Singh, Shreys Parasrampuria and Devari—featuring spectrices, paintings and artworks incorporating hiar, papier mache, bandmade paper and other materials. You will notice themse from everybay life as well as current ever such as the protests in Iran. Dorft miss artist Shubham Sharma's first-ever sole showcase at Oyan Museum. His visually aversiting mixed medic installation title: "Destroyer' has been inspired by the legend of Lord Shiva.
